

Working Sheet (Instructions)

The following 5 paragraphs contain descriptions of European cities. The descriptions are text fragments extracted from the website www.wikitravel.org. Your task is to create a hyperlink for each paragraph to the corresponding website for that city on www.wikitravel.org. Create the links using the following instructions exactly:

- 1) Place the word document on the *left* half of the screen.
- 2) Place the web browser on the *right* half of the screen.
- 3) Enter the present time here (e.g. 13:57):
- 4) Read the paragraph and find the first occurrence of the city name.
- 5) Go to wikitravel.org and search for the city by typing its name.
- 6) Create the hyperlink (Insert → Hyperlink) by adding the web address to the dialog (copy & paste may not work – so you'd have to type it).
- 7) Repeat from point 3 on, until all cities/paragraphs are linked.
- 8) Enter the time again:
- 9) Extend the list of city descriptions by adding a few lines from the cities London, Lisbon, Vienna, Bern and Dublin taken from wikitravel.org. Create the hyperlinks again as before.
- 10) Enter the time again:
- 11) Arrange the 10 paragraphs by the city names alphabetical order by copying and pasting the paragraphs (Berlin, Bern, Dublin,...,Vienna).
- 12) Evaluate the use of our gaze-contingent cursor, see end of document.

----- Descriptions of Cities

Located in the north of the country on the river Seine, Paris has the reputation of being the most beautiful and romantic of all cities, brimming with historic associations and remaining vastly influential in the realms of culture, art, fashion, food and design. Dubbed the City of Light (la Ville Lumière), it is the most popular tourist destination in the world.

Confusingly, several incompatible district systems are used in Prague. Partially, different systems are from different historic periods, but at least three different systems are used today for different purposes. To make things even worse, a single district name can be used in all the systems, but with different meanings.

It is the largest city in Germany and has a population of 4.3 million within its metropolitan area and 3.4 million within the city limits. Berlin is best known for its historical associations as the German capital, for its lively nightlife, for its many cafes, clubs, and bars, and for its numerous museums, palaces, and other sites of historic interest.

Rome, the "Eternal City", is the capital of Italy and of the Lazio (Latium) region. It's the famed city of the Seven Hills, La Dolce Vita, Vatican City and Three Coins in the Fountain. Its Historic Center is a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

It is the capital of Spain, as well as the capital of the autonomous community of the same name (Comunidad de Madrid). It is Spain's largest city, with a population (city) of 3.228 million (July 2005) and 5.843 million (metropolitan area). Madrid is best known for its great cultural and artistic heritage, a good example of which is the El Prado museum. Madrid also boasts some of the liveliest nightlife in the world.
